ACC Continues Banner Year **Green Bay's MGM Draws 572** *New Central Region Record*

Milwaukee Rookie Bill Philleo Takes Title

The 10th Annual MGM Open, held in Green Bay, Wisconsin, February 23, 24, and 25th attracted a record crowd of 572 players, and another 246 signed up for the consolation match. This well-run tournament broke all records for the Central Region.

Rookie tournament player Bill Philleo, Milwaukee, WI, posted a come-from-behind victory over veteran Jim Rein, Carver, MN. Harry Langman, Appleton, WI, finished 3rd, followed by local Jim Heemstra in 4th.

In the consolation match, Bill Anschutz, Sturgeon Bay, WI, emerged victorious over crafty veteran Joe L'Hullier, Marquette, MI.

Friday and Saturday doubles drew huge crowds (Friday night had some 270 teams competing). Claribel Abbet and Matt Leitner,

a Manitowoc, WI duo, took honors Friday night, and Ed Bialowski, Two Rivers, WI, teamed with Diane Burkland, Green Bay, WI, to win the Saturday night event. Frank and Roberta Schweig, a Carpentersville, IL, pair missed winning Friday by an eyelash.

ACC Membership Secretary Jeff Monroe, Napa, CA, took top qualifying honors and a hefty Q-pool check. Gary Paulson was high qualifier in the consolation event. Ten 28-hands were scored in sanctioned play, tying a record for the ACC.

Directors Bob Miller, Tom Gallagher, and Jerry Lemke, with help from Sue Miller, Sally Gallagher, and Judy Lemke, and a great crew of volunteers combined to make the MGM Tournament one of America's finest.

Cribbage fans are happy with DeLynn's first issue of "Cribbage World." The editor himself spent 11 hours along with Neoma Kern, a total of 22 hours, in putting the labels on. DeLynn is learning production from bottom up and top down.

Through the grapevine we learned that in a four-week period, membership went up 200 members. We must be doing something right.

What are Blue Points? How does one get them? A California member called and wanted the answer to those questions.

Well, he called the right guy because this writer and Duane Steinhauer, a Madison cribbage player and director of contract bridge tournaments, set up a system of Red, Blue, and Gold Points for rating players. The Congress Directors at the Buffalo, NY, meeting some years ago, rejected the idea. Instead, plans were to adopt bonus points for major tournaments.

Steinhauer was consulted because of his experience in working with the bridge rating system. The idea was just great for the Grass Roots competition and was adopted. In brief, this is how it works. At the local club level, Red Points are earned on First place receives 100% of the number of entries, 2nd 80%, 3rd 70%, 4th 60%, and on down with increments of 10. There is a 20% difference between 1st and 2nd.

Blue Points are earned when three or more Grass Roots clubs meet in a contest at a given location. Of course, in order to compete, one must be a bona fide member of a club and certified by the director of that area. It is a closed tournament.

Going on further, Gold Points are reserved for a national gathering of the Grass Rooters. It is hoped that a few years from now, the Grass Rooters play for the gold.

Butch Reynolds is conducting a Grass Roots regional meet the day before the Santa Maria Super Bowl of Cribbage. His brochure announced the Grass Roots Special and that prompted the telephone call.

The major tobacco companies are fighting back. They are not permitted to advertise over radio or TV, so now their program is to flood the country with playing cards.

It has been learned from reliable sources, that one company ordered 2 1/2 million give-away decks. You tournament directors should not get excited over getting free cards. These cards are a no-no because their back patterns have a different top and bottom.

We learned a long time ago not to play for stakes with such decks. It is a simple maneuver to face all the backs the same way except for the sevens or fives, for example. As these cards

are dealt, a player knows the location of these important cards. Then too, cribbage addicts would tire of watching billboard characters sliding over a crib table.

Another book on cribbage has been published. The author is Nelson Ira Pendergast of Albany, NY, and the title is: "Everything I know on How to Play Winning Cribbage." The size of the book is 8 1/2 x 11 and has a spiral binding. In reviewing the book Cynthia Freeman said: "It left me breathless!" There are 28 pages of high quality paper and the special invisible ink has been used by the printer. Nelson is looking for help in distributing his life's work.

Leo Schwedsky of Lyndon Station, WI, reports that he is coming back strong from his unfortunate happenings of the last few years. First, both legs were broken when a scaffold crashed to the ground. Last year, when he should have been managing the Wisconsin Dells tournament, he was in the Baraboo hospital recovering from a ruptured appendix.

"Dottie and I will be having the Dells Tournament of Champions the week after Labor Day," said the former Tournament of Champions winner. "We have missed our many friends so much. But, although I have another scheduled bout with surgery to eliminate a hernia that resulted from the last one, I will be running the show at the Dells."

We are all pulling for you, Leo, and hope that in the meantime our cribbers will make a pit stop at Lyndon Station when passing to and from the Twin Cities.



George Bickford a Winner! Central New England Open Survives Snow Storms

Despite foul weather, the Central New England Open had only six no-shows out of 192 peggers.

One on New England's toughest peggers--George Bickford, E. Longmeadow, MA--took all the marbles. A. Perry, Hopedale, MA, finished a strong 2nd, followed by Michael Wood, Marlboro, MA, and Marie Smith, Dexter, ME.

A large 128-person consolation was won by K. C. Finley, Enfield, CT. Barbara Brown, Hope Valley, RI, took 2nd.

Congratulations to director Paul Cormier for running a successful tournament, despite the weather. New Englanders once again prove they are a hardy bunch.

Harry Palmer Earns Grand Master Rating

Harry Palmer, West Springfield, MA, became the 9th player to earn Grand Master by scoring some 628 Master Points for his fine 3rd place finish at the huge ACC Open in Reno February 4th. As a result, his lifetime total went well over the magic 4,000 Master Points needed to earn Grand Master.

Cribbage World erroneously reported that Milwaukee's Duane Toll was the 9th Grand Master. Duane, however, is the 10th to earn this honor.

Harry is a past member of the ACC Board of Directors, and a 1988 All-American.

Despite the snow outside, the cards were warm inside for Roberta Dyer, as she claimed the Northwest Open title, with a 4-3 win over tough-pegging Harry Kantas, Beaverton, OR. In the final game, heading down the home stretch, Roberta hit a K-K-Q-Q with a jack cut for the clincher.

Leon Christy, a strong pegger from Richland, WA, took 3rd. Another tough Washington pegger--Betty Johnson--from Spokane was 4th. Hometown favorite, Les Sissel (member of the smooth-pegging Sissel clan) won the consolation. Jim McNulty, Libby, MT, took 2nd.


Verne Nielsen, Portland, OR, scored a 29-hand, but, alas, in the non-sanctioned Friday "High Roller."

This tournament had a full range of events, including junior tournament play.

The Northwest Open is the longest running tournament in that section of the country. This 13th annual drew a record crowd of 158 players, due in part to strong local support. By Baker City Council resolution, some \$1,600 was appropriated to help the local tournament. 1,000 decks of custom-designed cards are now in use in Baker City as a result of this city council action.

Tournament Guidelines to be Studied

A new committee to further study Tournament Requirements and Guidelines has been appointed by ACC VP-Policy Ev Bey, with concurrence of the Executive Committee.

This committee will be headed by Cathy Perkins, Bear Creek, NC. It includes two members from each of the three ACC regions: Fred Detting, White Bear Lake, MN; Mickey Griffin, Lincoln, NE; Ken Cambell, Modoc, SC; and Larry Samet, Wellesley Hills, MA.

They will be studying mandatory requirements for two established tournament formats that were approved by the Board of Directors at the Reno, NV meeting: round-robin and double-elimination. Revised mandatory requirements for head-to-head tournaments were adopted at the Reno board meeting, effective September 1, 1990.

Definition of the 85% payback requirement will also undergo study.

In addition, "guidelines"--not mandatory rules--will be developed for doubles tournaments, Q-pools, insurance pools, and other non-sanctioned events such as team events, daily doubles pairings, etc.

The committee is expected to make a preliminary report at the July 27 Board of Director's meeting in Raleigh, NC.



Already, they are talking about organizing a major tournament for the first championship of Texas.

We had several other inquiries lately, and an interesting one came from St. Charles, IL. Apparently, their three-person league ended its season, and hearing of the Grass Roots plan, they made an inquiry. The Congress has several members in St. Charles and nearby Geneva, so we are expecting them to support the idea.

As there are six divisions in the Grass Roots program based upon the size of the club and the number of active members, it isn't too late to form clubs and to participate this season. Tournament play extends from September 1 through June 30th each year.

The central section which has been lagging in establishing clubs is really beginning to move. Jim Blough of Kentwood, MI, awakened that state with his club in the Grand Rapids area. He soon was campaigning in other cities to get some action. The latest club established in Michigan was just formed outside the Ann Arbor area as Don McEwen organized at Ypsilanti #105. It's time for Iowa, with one club, to sponsor other groups. The Grass Roots spreads slowly but they keep sprouting.

MASTER POINT PARADE

How Master Points are earned:

Tournament must be sanctioned by the American Cribbage Congress.

Qualifying Round: Top 1/8 earns one-quarter points, i.e., 100 players, top qualifier earns 25 points, 2nd earns 23, etc.

Main Tournament: Top 1/8 earns full points, i.e., 100 players, champion earns 100 points, 2nd earns 92, 3rd earns 84, etc. If 40 or more players, Bonus Points are earned: 1st earns 40 bonus points, 2nd earns 20, 3rd earns 10, and 4th earns 5. In this example, No. 1 earns 140 points (100 + 40).

Consolation Tournament: Top 1/8 earns one-half points, i.e., 64 players, 1st earns 32 points, 2nd earns 28 points, 3rd earns 24 points, etc. Bonus Points are earned: 1st earns 20 bonus points, 2nd earns 10 points, 3rd earns 5 points and 4th earns 3 points. In this example, No. 1 earns 52 points (32 + 20).


