



Bob Drukman Scores 17th 29-Hand

Al Miller Takes National Open

Leo Horigan, Phil True, Warren Sondericker, Bill Wakeman Win Satellites

Al Miller came to Raleigh in 1987 for the 14th annual National Open and came up a tad short, finishing 2nd behind John Worley (Burlington, NC), but in the 20th annual this Nashua, NH pegger went all the way to claim the championship. And he is one of the few winners to go all the way without losing a match...taking ten straight best 4 of 7 matches. With this effort Al picked up a sizeable \$3,600 and 319 MRP's in this 350-pegger event. Miller also serves the ACC as Judges Examiner when he is not busy salting away cribbage games.

Chris Wilkinson, a young player from Raleigh made a valiant effort, but came up a bridesmaid, losing the final match 4-2. Chris took home a purse of \$2,100 to make the weekend one to remember, however.

Tony Del Tufo, West Bridgewater, MA, finished his season in style by claiming 3rd, and young Brian Heroux, Woonsocket, RI, finished the season with a bang by taking 4th...and narrowly missing All-American honors with a late-season drive that netted some 1,028 MRP's (and 12th place nationally). He did earn All-Eastern Region Team honors.

174 peggers played the consolation, with Leo Horigan, Stoughton, MA, taking home the marbles (and \$1,200). Jean Taylor, Swansea, MA copped 2nd, followed by local Aaron Korsh in 3rd, and Bill Kraatz, Niagara Falls, NY in 4th.

A new twist to the National Open had a Friday Early Bird event and Rit Alkas, Manchester, CT took home some \$1,260, followed by Jim Ready, Stoughton, MA (\$700).

The other satellite winners: Phil True was a long way from his Richland, WA home, and he paid for the long trek by taking the Losers-Losers (Joyce Bryant, Jarrettsville, MD, took 2nd), Warren Sondericker, Greenfield, WI, is no stranger to winning and he claimed the Last Roundup (Bill Shoemaker, W. Hartford, CT, took 2nd). The Sunday Special saw Bill Wakeman, Hayward, CA take the top prize, and another western player--Ron Morgan, Missoula, MT--taking 2nd.

A highlight of this 20th National Open saw **Bob Drukman** score a 29-hand...the 17th, and final, gem of the 1993 season.

After many trials and tribulations due to site changes, and the myriad problems this has entailed, Grand National XII is off and winging at the Joker's Wild, exit 101, I-90, Missoula, MT.

The adjacent Reserve Street Inn will be the registration, score-card pickup area, and will handle souvenir sales. This will take place in their reception area near the lobby. This will open up the playing area at the Jokers Wild.

Rooms are sold out at the Reserve Street Inn, and other motels close by are going fast. If you find no rooms available from last month's CW list (page 2), try the Orange Street Inn at exit 104, I-90 (a fast 4-minute trip to exit 101). Their rates are \$36 single, \$48 double. As for the possibility of the extra player throwing a game, he feels almost all players give the game their best shot...and perhaps a small wager will keep interest high!

158th Master **Dwight Christiansen Tops** **188 in Rhode Island**

The 2nd Annual New England Inaugural drew a huge crowd of 188 peggers from 12 states and Canada August 8...and Dwight Christiansen earned his Master rating in style by winning this event.

This Stratford, CT, pegger nipped crafty Leo Horigan, Stoughton, MA, in a hotly contested final, and picked up 200 MRP's to wing it over the 2,000 mark (lifetime) to earn the ACC's 158th Master rating.

Donna LaFleur, Bristol, CT, earned 368 MRP's last season, and is off again to a fine start this year by finishing 3rd, edging newly crowned Master Al Tenenbaum, Cranbury, NJ. (who also had a fine 1993 season with 603 MRP's).

The top qualifier was John Marshall, North Providence, RI, who scored 10 wins, and 4 skunks for a whopping 24 GP's. George Taylor, Swansea, MA, was 2nd, with 23 GP's. Unfortunately, both were zero for eight in the playoffs and finished 47th and 48th...an oddity they hope will not be repeated!

First place in the 122-pegger consolation went to Tommy Woodall, Rockwood, TN, who narrowly defeated Paul Musard, N. Providence, RI, in the final game of their match. Arthur Martin (Northboro, MA) edged J. J. Rooney (Randolph, MA) for 3rd place.

Henry DeLong, Woburn, MA, scored the first 29-hand of the 1994 season in the last game of the day.

The three-person team event had 41 entries and the team of Al Dinwoodie, Donna LaFleur, and Ken Vetterline took honors (51 GP's).

Some \$255 was donated to the Rhode Island School for the Deaf in memory of former Grand National champion Bill Seymour.

Directors Lee Norris and Ford Jewer were pleased with the increased attendance from last year, attesting to a well-run initial tournament.


A long-time Rhode Island player died at home on Friday, August 6. A former member of GR Club 31 and 168, he will be sadly missed by his friends and fellow competitors.

Gil Johnson Wins In Portland, Takes 1994 MRP Lead

Gil Johnson, Spokane, WA, is the first out of the chute for the 1994 season, and is off and winging with the national MRP lead by taking the 170-pegger Portland Summer Open. By winning the first sizeable tournament of the season (after qualifying 5th), Gil leads the nation with some 227 MRP's.

Willie Evans, the Richland, WA, tournament director finished 2nd...his 3rd bridesmaid finish over the years.

Two Portland area players took 3rd and 4th: Gene Goodell and Lee Bodkin.

The qualifying round had an unusual finish, as both Sue Temple (Beaverton, OR) and Leslie Hein (Washougal, WA) were in the hunt for top honors, and had to play the 22nd and last game head to head. The winner was top qualifier...Leslie Hein (38 18 +201).

124 peggers played the consolation event and two Roseburg, OR players took honors. Jean Edwards took first, and Donna Hassett finished 2nd. Harvey Honeycutt, the Beatty, OR king of cribbage won 3rd, followed by Verne Nielsen, Portland in 4th.

Verne and his wife Jeanette also had an unusual qualifying round, as they finished 1-2, picking up a nifty \$360 in "Q" money.

In the early birds, Larry and Donna Hassett took the doubles (\$445), while All-American Paul Hatcher continues his hot satellite event wins by taking the High Roller (\$685). And no one could touch Bev Sauer in the Saturday night game.

1992 National Champion Phyllis Schmidt has accepted a challenge to play the ACC's 1993 National Champion Jesse Jarrell an exhibition game on the world's largest cribbage board at the upcoming Grand National XII in Missoula.

Grand Master Schmidt, the cribbage queen from Williamstown, MA nailed the 1992 title by amassing some 1,442 MRP's. Life Master Jarrell hails from Pittsburg, CA, and recently completed an outstanding season, winning the national title with some 1,500+ MRP's.

Ken Snyder is the co-owner of this huge 8' x 40' board. The board can normally be seen in front of his Valley Club in Ronan, MT, or at the Pheasant Lounge (other co-owner). Ken, the The Valley Club and Pheasant Lounge have graciously allowed this board to be used in Missoula for this unique game.

The game is scheduled to be played at 6 PM, Saturday, September 25 behind the Joker's Wild. And all rules are off. Spectators may hoot and holler and root for their favorite player (and may even yell at the official peggars who must lift and place four foot high pegs). The official "line" is take your pick at even odds.

Joan Rein, Carver, MN, was voted into the Cribbage Hall of Fame at the recent Board of Director's meeting in Raleigh, NC.

Rein thus becomes only the 16th person to earn this prestigious honor...and the first of the fair sex (and the first from Minnesota).

Needing 16 votes of the 20 members present at the BOD meeting, the third ballot proved to be her winner, garnering the 16 needed votes.

Rein has earned her honors on the board, and with exemplary work for the ACC. She has served many years as the ACC's secretary, and has the massive task every year of sending invites to eligible players for the huge Tournament of Champions (last year, for example, some 600+ invitations were mailed). Recently, she has been burning up the track with high finishes, winning the Hawkeye Classic in Des Moines, finishing 2nd in St. Cloud, MN, and yet another high finish at the National Open in Raleigh, NC.

Pistol Packin' Pegger

Luanne Felstet nailed the Montana Open Championship last April, and has been seen on the NW circuit with regularity. She drove to Reno to compete in the July event...and then flew to her Missoula, MT home.

Oops...she almost didn't get on the airplane...as her suitcase contained a loaded pistol! Horrors! The X-ray machine picked it up loud and clear! She had forgotten that she had packed the gun.
