\$3,950 To Veteran's Relief Fund

Russell Adams Tops In Reno Horigan, Bernard Make MRP Move

Professor Odds with a Ph. D. knew cribbage from A to Z. Expecting two skunks, he played a dull dunce, but finished at minus thirty-three! This clever "cribberick" was penned by Professor Russell Adams, Minneapolis, MN.

However, despite perhaps a few dull dunces in Reno July 3, Professor Adams zipped to the championship at the annual Independence Day Open, topping some 312 peggers in the process. And a nifty bonus came with the 287 MRP's...Russell also earned the 29th Grand Master awarded by the American Cribbage Congress by topping the 4,000 MRP mark (lifetime). And to make his weekend a complete success, he also won the Saturday Night High Roller event.

Roberta Nelson, Sunnyvale, CA, came close, as she took Adams to the wire, but settled for 2nd place in this huge tournament. Her bundle of 265 MRP's...and a sizeable prize made her trip over Donner Pass very well worth while. Walt Swearingen, Kennewick, WA nailed 3rd place, and Larry Lee Hassett, Roseburg, OR finished 4th.

Marlene Lazachek, Greenfield, WI, is edging in on her Master rating by taking qualifying honors (and 96 MRP's) with a super 38 (18) +269 card.

As this year's Master Point race winds down, Master Ed Horigan, Virginia Beach, VA made a huge jump upwards by qualifying 5th (77 MRP's) and finishing 12th (186 MRP's) and with the total 263 points earned, vaults over the 1,200 mark for this season...with but only three short weeks to play. Life Master Joe Bernard, Libertyville, IL, also made a nifty move by finishing in the 17-32 bracket in both the Main and Consolation events, picking up some 136 MRP's in the process, topping 1,300 MRP's for the year...and took over 2nd place nationally.

226 peggers signed on for a Consolation event that tops most Main events in participants, and Margaret Larsen, Hayward, CA walked off with the top prize. Frank Danielski, a Master pegger from Appleton, WI, took home 2nd, followed by newly crowned Grand Master Dick Graham, Aurora, CO, in 3rd, and Mike Barber, Unalaska, AK finished 4th.

The Friday Early Bird event was nailed by a "Grand Slam" 9 for 9 (19) +188 by Bryan Riches.

Once again the Sands were great hosts, with Barbara Woodward doing yeoman's work...and the Veteran's Relief Fund netted some \$3,950, contributed by the players.

1995: Hockomock Cribbage Classic

Medford Smith Tops 148 In Wareham

The Cape Cod Extra's final run was won by Medford Smith, West Roxbury, MA. A sizeable 148 peggers turned out for this annual affair that will have a new name in 1995: The Hockomock Cribbage Classic. This re-named event will be played June 24-25, 1995.

Medford picked up a nifty 160 MRP's, in addition to a nice winners check in nailing this event.

Edward Donahue (Mansfield, MA) picked up a 29-hand in March, but this time around he finished a solid 2nd, followed by Neil Matheson (Fairhaven, MA) in 3rd and Bill Packard (North Attleboro, MA) in 4th.

Dick West, Attleboro, MA had the hot hand in the qualifying round to take honors...and rookie Richard Brault qualified 4th, picking up 46 MRP's to keep his top ten hopes alive, standing at the 800 MRP mark for the year.

Another pegger having a fine year is Cindy Veradt, Taunton, MA. She not only qualified 6th, but finished in the 5-8 bracket to pick up some 156 MRP's to run her yearly total to nearly 800, giving her an outside chance of earning a berth on this year's Eastern Region All-Star Team.

Dwight Christiansen (Stratford, CT) earned his Master rating this year...and he continues his fine play by winning the 90-pegger Consolation. He nipped another perennial winner, Joe Ramos (W. Warwick, RI) in the title match. Napoleon Soares (Brockton, MA) took 3rd, followed by Margaret Torrey (Mansfield, MA) in 4th.

Director David Clemmey reported some \$150 was donated to the Boston Children's Hospital.

Connie Staven Captures Madison Masters Classic XVI

Connie Staven from nearby Racine, WI, nailed the recent Madison Masters Classic XVI and has earned an automatic invite to next year's Tournament of Champions in Reno...and moves into the Central Region's top 50, standing at 448 MRP's for this cribbage year.

Master pegger Kenneth Capadagli, Bensenville, IL finished a fine 2nd in the large field of 178 peggers. Richard Horvath, Milwaukee, WI took 3rd and Norbert Upton, Eagan, MN, not only finished 4th, but earned the 191st Master rating awarded by the ACC.

Another pegger earning his Master rating was Al Schaefer, Milwaukee, WI, as he finished 8th, picking up 118 MRP's in the process...and winged it over the 2,000 mark (lifetime).

108 peggers stayed for the Consolation and Smokey Cornwell, Westfield, WI came away the winner and tacked on 60 MRP's to his lifetime total. Vincent Capaul, Monona, WI, took 2nd, followed by Ron Hirshman and Life Master Jim McManus in 3rd and 4th (Milwaukee peggers).

This event is one of the largest played in the Central Region, and is played under the supervision of Gaylord Matti and Jerry Dickinson.

An interesting variation in scoring the qualifying round was given a try (all Game Point ties at the bottom qualifying score were allowed to qualify). Players reactions were mixed, as some were awarded byes by blind draw. The Board of Directors will evaluate this method of scoring to see if it merits further trials.

Frank Zabrowski Appointed Director of Senior Judges

Monterey, CA's Frank Zabrowski has been appointed Director of Senior Judges, according to Ev Bey, Vice President-Policy.

The appointment was made by Jeff Shimp, Commissioner of the ACC Judges program, with concurrence of the Executive Committee.

Zabrowski was the originator of the Senior Judges program as Testing Examiner for many years. He dropped out of the activity for several years due to health reasons, but has now been cleared by his doctors and will again resume an active role in the program he developed.

Senior Judges are experienced, qualified ACC judges who have shown outstanding ability to analyze situations and come to a fair and reasonable solution, making judgmental decisions that are not presently covered by the ACC rules.

A maximum of 8 Senior Judges have been approved by the ACC Board of Directors for each of the three Regions, with terms running for 3 years, and eligible for re-appointment.

Besides Shimp, the Central Region has 7 Senior Judges: Martha Fingleton, Ron Hamilton, Scott Kooistra, Bob McCabe, Joan Rein, and Don Tofte.

Senior Judges from the Eastern Region, 5 in number at this time, include: Testing Examiner Al Miller, Rules Committee Chairman Cathy Perkins (who serves as Director of Research & Development for the Judges Program), George Bickford, Bob Gombatz, and Phyllis Schmidt.

Besides Zabrowski, the Western Region's 6 Senior Judges include: Dick Cornwell, DeLynn Colvert, Roy Hofbauer, Betty Johnson, and Gene Sissel.

Shimp expects to make additional appointments to round out the Senior Judge's ranks.

ACC Comes to Amicable Settlement With Karl Grube

The Cribbage In Schools Program, directed by Karl Grube, Whitmore Lake, MI, became involved in a dispute with the ACC over finances.

Martha Fingleton, the ACC's National Tournament Commissioner, was assigned to work out a settlement with Grube. She reports that an amicable settlement has been worked out, and the dispute will be settled in 45 days.

No Prize Money If Not ACC Member

This continual, is required, is not required problem of ACC membership has been brought up before the BOD every year for at least the last 4 years, and every year either the BOD says that it is not required or that it is required and sometimes when they don't want to respond to the problem they will table the situation until the next meeting, and that is because they want the BOD members from that area to be present rather than those that are in the area where the current membership question is to be voted upon. This problem apparently cannot be resolved by the BOD members because they are afraid that they will be criticized for their vote. I believe that this problem will never be resolved until it is presented to all members of our cribbage organization and they decide by majority vote on the required membership.

This lame excuse that the non-member pays his \$1.50 as well as the other contestants is a sad explanation. Everytime that I go to our GR club to play, which is weekly, I am asseted (sic) \$1 which goes into our local checking account to help pay for the operational expenses of our club, which included buying necessary supplies for running our sanctioned ACC tournaments and to support other charitable efforts that may arise in our local area. Our club plays 40 local tournaments a year and if you multiply that \$40 figure times the number of players that we have in our club there is a sizeable contribution towards promoting ACC tournaments and GR membership. What kind of goodwill does that player who does not belong to either organization provide. His only purpose is to play in those tournaments where he can get the best return for his investment. I have asked a number of non-ACC

contestants how come they play in our tournaments, and that includes our big tournaments that are held in Reno, why they play and that answer is always the same, they like the odds, and why in the hell should I join ACC or GR. The more players that there is the better is my return on my investment.


Now as far as Joe Ramos putting in 30 hours per week and tournament directors also adding time to the effort, how about the club directors who put in at least 3 hours a week, 42 weeks a year and sometimes more. The club directors are elected, Joe Ramos volunteered because he loves the challenge and the game and the tournament directors enjoy the results of their efforts.

So since the BOD can't seem to finalize a firm decision on the membership requirement, why not let the overall membership vote on this issue for an answer once and for all that shall be added to the rules and regulations of the organization, GR and the ACC.

The problem of monitoring the contestants membership can and will easily be resolved by simplifying (sic) not paying off the winners unless a ACC membership can be proven at the time of payoff or by confirmation with appropriate membership agencies. People will soon learn to guard their membership card as well as they do their Visa or M/Card.




