Phyllis Schmidt Nails Tri-Valley

She's Back!

Phyllis Schmidt, the Williamstown, MA queen of cribbage, is back! After winning All-American honors in 1991, 1992 (USA-1), and 1993, she narrowly missed the team in 1994...but she's back! After qualifying 13th at the recent 182-pegger Tri-Valley Open in Medway, MA, she continued on to win the championship ...and pick up another 234 MRP's. Her 1995 MRP total stands at over 800, and propels her, once again, into the MRP top-ten race.

Schmidt is the ACC's top-ranked player of the fair sex, and earned Life Master last year.

Louis Caccia, Newtonville, MA, is having a fine year on the boards, and with a 2nd place finish has winged it over the 400 MRP mark. Harvey Glass, W. Hartford, CT nailed 3rd, followed by Marguerite McKenna, Bellingham, MA in 4th.

Richard Andrew topped all qualifiers, and this Hinsdale, NH pegger picked up some 67 MRP's for earning this honor.

Stephen Ryan, Warwick, RI, owned the Consolation event, as he not only qualified No. 1, but continued his fine run and copped the top spot in the playoffs...and earned a combined 80 MRP's.

Brownie Lusia, Bristol, CT, took 2nd in this sizeable 116-pegger event. Steve Sattler (Baltimore, MD) finished 3rd, followed by Bob Drukman, N. Easton, MA, in 4th. Drukman now stands at the 700 MRP mark for the year, keeping his All-American hopes alive.

Not only did Phyllis Schmidt win this event, she also scored one of three 28-hands. Joe Beauregard (Pawtucket, RI) and Bruce Sattler (Baltimore, MD) scored the other two.

This event was Pat Llewellyn's 2nd annual, and another huge crowd was on hand. She was ably assisted by Sharlene and Bill Medeiros. The 3rd annual Tri-Valley is scheduled for March 10, 1996. Mark your calendars. She also added that the players helped the Veteran's Hospital by donating \$400.

The President's Column

As you're probably all aware by now, the ACC Board of Directors has adopted increased dues, effective August 1, 1995.

In the first dues hike since 1988, ACC members will see their annual dues increased to \$10 and married couples will go from \$8 to \$12. Junior dues remain the same, at \$3.

Ever-rising second class mailing costs for the Cribbage World eat up most of the dues increase. At the same time, Directors are moving to centralize and automat ACC record-keeping, reorganizing our present scattered volunteer set-up to coordinate all such functions and provide reasonable back-up.

In effect, we're a growing, vibrant organization that is outgrowing its spontaneous, patched-up system, relying on a dozen or more volunteers spread from Vermont to North Carolina to Montana to California (and points in between) for financial accounting, Master Points statistics, Grass Roots Clubs activities, secretarial services, *Cribbage World* publication, membership records, the judges program, historical archives storage, etc., etc.

I'm sure everybody will agree that our ACC dues have been a tremendous bargain in years past...and even with this increase, ACC membership is still a good deal.

At the same time, starting with the new tournament year, the sanction fee will be increased to \$2...up 50 cents over the current \$1.50 charge.

What do you get in return? We're now giving additional Master Points for high qualifiers in the Consolation tournaments; an added opportunity to garner more Master Points and earn increased honors and bragging rights.

It has come to our attention that good sportsmanship in playing the game of cribbage is

being sidetracked by some players in pursuit of a "win-win-win at any cost" theory.

We have had reports of incidents concerning abuse of the rules by smart-ass players, taking advantage of shady maneuvers to gain a cheap win. Remember, our rules have been established to take care of controversial situations that happen, not to be manipulated for some sharp's advantage. A word to the wise!

Ron Hamilton Tops In Marinette, Earns Grand Master

Ron Hamilton, fresh from his duties as Director of the recent Capital City Classic in St. Paul (and Grand National XIII) has won the recent 174-pegger Tri-Cities Open in Marinette, WI...and in the process earned his Grand Master.

By topping the 4,000 Master Point mark, Hamilton becomes only the 43rd ACC player to have attained this plateau.

Ted Hokenson, Marquette, MI, continues his fine play and with a 2nd place finish tacked on to his Tournament of Champions win in Reno, is on an outstanding run. And this time he earns some MRP's (none were awarded in Reno for that "by invitation only" meet).

Doug Henderson, Racine, WI took 3rd in this 174-pegger event, followed by Bill Vanderhei, Oneida, WI in 4th.

Deb Schisel, Kenosha, WI, finished 9-16, and with the 84 MRP's earned will remain among the top ten in the Central Region.

Wayne Steinmetz, Milwaukee, is a perennial MRP leader in the Central Region, and he won the 107-pegger Consolation, picking up another 60 MRP's. Robert Brown, Forestville, WI, took 2nd, followed by Gene McDonald, Green Bay, and Lloyd Kraft, Seymour, WI, in 3rd and 4th.

Director Mick Michaelis drew another large crowd in his 14th annual meet...and the Salvation Army received a donation of \$261 from the players. Michaelis reports that this event will be played for the 15th time next April 12, 13, and 14.

Warren L. Swett Memorial Bud Atkinson Hot In Illinois

Bud Atkinson from nearby North Chicago was hot at the recent Warren L. Swett Memorial Open in Crystal Lake, IL. He not only took qualifying honors, but continued on and won the championship as well!

Three Central Region MRP frontrunners showed their mettle on the boards by finishing 2-3-4. Al Schaeffer, Milwaukee, Joe Bernard, Libertyville, IL, and Marvin Lang, Woodstock, IL all took home a bundle of MRP's and will hold on to their top spots in their Region.

1994 National Champion Bob Julian (Milwaukee) nailed the 64-pegger Consolation, and keeps alive his hopes of repeating as USA's no. 1 pegger. His yearly total is over 800, and with his full schedule for the remaining year, he will certainly be a threat for repeat honors.

Grace Cummings, Grand National III's winner, took home a nifty 2nd, followed by Don Tofte, and John Stamschror in 3rd and 4th. Cummings and Tofte hail from Madison, WI, and Stamschror is from Waukesha, WI.

Director John Swett reported three 28-hands were scored: Frank Krchak, Glen Duncomb, and Ken Capodagli all scored this gem. Swett reported 95% paybacks.

George Rasmussen Back In Oregon
George Rasmussen recently retired and has moved back to Chelhalis, OR from his Virginia home. Oregon Players, beware! He keeps copious cribbage notes and is a formidable player.

Hugh Berry, Richmond, VA, nailed 2nd, and national MRP front-runner Bob Gombatz finished 3rd (after qualifying 2nd), picking up another 96 MRP's. Gombatz's is setting a torrid pace this cribbage year, and is near the 1,200 mark. Only Concord, CA's Steve Reynolds is near this number. Wally Wheeler, Riverdale, GA, finished 4th.

Bernard Whitfield topped the field in the qualifying round (36 17 +251). This pegger hails from Raleigh, NC.

Victor Struminger, Atlanta, GA, copped the 60-pegger Consolation, followed by Dave O'Neil, Clarkston, GA, in 2nd. Earl McGrory, N. Kingstown, RI, took 3rd, and Richard Kerr, Rutherfordton, NC was 4th.

Bob Gombatz Tops Virginia Championship

Virginia staged two sanctioned events recently, the first being the Virginia Championship, played in Richmond in mid-January, and the second played in Virginia Beach in mid-February. Both events, oddly enough, drew exactly 100 players.

In Richmond, the streaking Bob Gombatz, Raleigh, NC, took the championship, tacking on another 142 MRP's to his nation-leading total. Bernard Whitfield, another Raleigh player nailed 2nd, followed by Bob Deangelo, Fredericksburg, VA in 3rd (after topping the field in the qualifying round), and Tom Wilson, Charlottesville, VA taking 4th.

Mitchel Lewis (Newport News, VA) won the 70-pegger Consolation, with John Noblet (Alexandria, VA) taking 2nd.

Director Rick Allen is planning a re-run of this event January, 1996.

The Virginia Beach Classic, played a month later in Virginia Beach was won by local Bob Moore, topping veteran pegger George Bright from Atlanta in the playoffs. And once again, the streaking Bob Gombatz took 3rd (after topping the qualifying round). Local Ed Horigan, 1994 All-American, nailed 4th, keeping his 1995 All-American hopes alive.

John Noblet, Alexandria, VA captured the 72-pegger Consolation, With Rick Allen, Richmond, VA in 2nd. Noblet was 2nd in Richmond's Consolation....and is improving with every event! Marvin Lang, Woodstock, IL took 3rd, and Russ Perkins, Bear Creek, NC finished 4th.

Heroux, Horigan Take Honors In New England

Two of the Eastern Region's front-runners in the MRP race have taken honors and have made a move upwards in this year's torrid race for All-American honors.

Brian Heroux, the ACC's youngest Master pegger, nailed the 126-pegger Cape Cod Classic February 26, and with the 144 MRP's earned has propelled this Woonsocket, RI pegger near the 800 mark for this cribbage year.

Last year Ed Horigan, Virginia Beach, VA, racked up 1,275 MRP's to earn a spot on the 1994 All-American team, and with a win at the recent 182-pegger Shore Shore Classic is standing at the 1,000 MRP mark for this cribbage year...and stands among the top five in the USA.

Bob Drukman, N. Easton, MA, finished 2nd in the Cape Cod event, keeping alive his chances for a top ten finish, standing at the 600 mark for the year. And Larry Samet, a Grand Master from Wellesley, MA, took 3rd and is also near the 600 mark. Earle Remington, Cumberland, RI, finished 4th.

Rookie Robert Medeiros picked up another 34 MRP's, and his amazing quest for national honors in his first year of sanctioned pegging continues. Four weeks later, at the South Shore Classic, Medeiros qualified 3rd in the 110-pegger Consolation, and continued on to win the playoffs...and another 77 MRP's. His yearly total is at the 1,000 mark...one of the best efforts

ever posted by a rookie player!

John Whitman, Seekonk, MA won the 76-pegger Cape Cod Consolation. Michael Wood, Marlboro, MA took 2nd, followed by Michael Samet, E. Northport, NY, in 3rd and Robert Medeiros (once again taking MRP's home) in 4th.

Paul Finley, Enfield, VT, picked up a nifty 188 MRP's in taking 2nd at the South Shore Open.

Another MRP front-runner is George Bickford, the Eastern Region's Tournament Commissioner from W. Springfield, MA, and he zipped to the top of the leader board by finishing 3rd, picking up another 182 MRP's and stands at the 1,100 mark. Only Stephen Reynolds, Concord, CA and Bob Gombatz, Raleigh, NC, are in this stratosphere. Harry Palmer, a Life Master from W. Springfield, nailed 4th and will make a move upward with the 172 MRP's.

Following Medeiros's win in the Consolation. Dick West (Attleboro, MA) took 2nd, Al Dinwoodie (Coventry, CT) was 3rd, and Robert Boulris (S. Bellingham, MA) nailed 4th.

David Clemmey, Mansfield, MA, throws his hat into the MRP ring with a 153-MRP 5th place finish, standing at the 800 mark. And Phyllis Schmidt (see cover story) nailed another 106 MRP's with a fine 9-16 finish to make a move towards the top, standing at the 800 mark.



George Webb, longtime director of the South Shore Classic is moving to Florida.


Webb reports that Jim Ready has agreed to take over the duties of directing this long-running tournament.



Life Master Gary Motley, Gresham, OR, has been pegging for many years on the tournament trail.



Poor Sir John Suckling has been catching it lately!



Ethics Violated?

Last month's CW reported a false claim of game ruling that cost Bart Sargent a game. Cribbage World has received several letters that feel the ruling was, at least, unethical, and at best, wrong. And, in fairness to all, we only have Mr. Sargent's interpretation of the ruling.

A few excerpts from letters:

..."The only clue as to what the judges determined to be inappropriate pegging was the fact that Sargent neglected to peg the "go" on his last card of the hand. His subsequent pegging out with sufficient pegs in his hand was correct as far as I can see. Without any other data it would seem to me that the judge who made the decision of a false claim of game erred since no player is obligated to take any of the points due him...

...It seems to me the judge in this case was totally wrong. There is no penalty for failure to peg points (unless you're playing muggins) and had Mr. Sargent failed to peg his "go" at any other point in the game, I'm sure his opponent would have been delighted he missed scoring the point. As long as his hand had enough points to win, Mr. Sargent should have been entitled to the game. His pegging of his hand, rather than the missed "go," was obviously not an overpegging situation....

Rex Paddock Solves Dilemma

Rex Paddock, Missoula, MT, dealt himself a dilemma. He had to make a choice of discards after being dealt 9-9-9-9-3-4. Of course the 9-9-9-9 was the obvious hold, discarding the 3-4, but Rex really wasn't in a position to give up peg points, but he decided to hold the four 9's anyway.

He held his breath as his opponent lead the first card. It was a 6! Nice break, 15-2! His opponent responded with a 7 for 22...another nice break, 31 for two! Now his opponent began another series, leading another 6! Another nice break! 15-2, again! And again his opponent played a 7 for 22. Wow! 31 for 2 again! Dilemma solved. Eight pegs to zero on a tough pegging hand! It would have been a different story, however, if his opponent held a 7-7-8-8, instead of a 6-6-7-7!

Rules Not Consistently Applied

A few years ago, the ACC Board of Directors (BOD) adopted a rule that a minimum payback of 85% of all tournament proceeds must be paid to the players in the form of prize money. This was passed due to a great deal of inconsistency across the country due to hold backs for expenses, charities, etc. Most tournaments have complied but, at a recent tournament in the midwest, the rule was flagrantly violated and, in addition, the tournament directors are paying themselves amounts in the four figures to run the tournament.

Many people contribute thousands of hours to make the ACC a success. Included are the BOD, the whole Grass Roots organization, judges, most tournament directors and the editor of this magazine. Are we so enamored with chasing master point accumulations that we refuse to enforce the rules for specific tournaments or people? Let's make sure this tournament and others like it are not sanctioned in the future unless the directors agree to conduct it according to ACC rules. Also, the Grass Roots organization needs to consistently enforce its rules among *all the clubs*.

Thanks for hearing my gripes and I hope you publish it.
