

The President's Column

Tournament Quiz

I think I asked the wrong question in my President's Letter in the June issue...should sanctioned tournaments be closed to all but ACC members? Should persons who do not play the Main tournament be allowed to participate in the Consolation tournament? And should satellite events be open to all, regardless of ACC membership?

The replies came in by phone, fax and e-mail, I opened the flood gates for the responses. Several hundred replies represented about 3% of the membership.

And the result: no point of agreement, no consensus.

I was hoping to obtain some member approval to guide the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors in making decisions on these sticklers.

By a vote of 2-1, respondents favored closing the Main sanctioned tournament to ACC members only. But there were many strong arguments why such tournaments should remain open to all as they now are.

A 50-50 response would allow anybody to play the Consolation tournament, regardless of whether they had played the Main event.

And another 2-1 result favored letting anybody...members or not...play any of the satellite events.

Rick Allen suggests a higher entry fee for non-members. Benjamin Wirz says let non-members play in one tournament (like the National Scrabble Assoc. does) and maybe they get hooked by winning prize money. Bob McCabe, our National Statistician, insists membership compliance is unenforceable because every tournament director would have to constantly check against an up-to-date membership roster. Roger Wilson, our new Treasurer, sees no reason why anyone shouldn't be allowed to play in the Main tournament... "We collect \$2 sanctioning fee and if they like it, they'll join!"

Duane Toll takes exception to being barred from a Consolation when he has to work on Saturday and can't play in the Main event. And, he says, there are some people...elderly or physically handicapped...who cannot play 21 or 22 qualifying games and shouldn't be barred from other events.

Boyd "McGramps" McDonald prefers that sanctioned events be closed to non-ACC players... "If a player can afford to enter, he can afford to become an ACC member." He and others said the Consolation should be just that, for players who do not qualify...don't let in the 1st and 2nd round of losing qualifiers.

Doris Perkins and her gang from Quincy, MA would require membership for the Main event... "Imagine someone coming in and winning the high roller, the time passers, the last hurrah, but never playing the Main, thus avoiding their share of hall expenses, food, other costs."

Although non-members don't earn master points, George Dean suggests reduced payoffs for non-members. Ralph Madsen and John Swett favor "open entries"... "Anything which excludes people from playing cribbage is counterproductive to one of our objectives."

Membership Secretary Larry Hassett says the goal of the ACC is to promote cribbage; therefore anyone should be allowed to play in the Consolation and the satellite events... "This is a great opportunity for timid players to get a start."

George McLaughlin and Helen Barack want the Main and Consolation restricted to ACC members, but as for the other satellite tournaments: "Those who pay, can play!"

So, we're right back where we started...all tournaments open to everybody, whether an ACC member or not.

Looking through the results in the June Cribbage World, there were only 3 non-members who made the finals out of 33 tournaments and over 300+ finalists...we're talking less than 1%.

Let's let well-enough alone. I see no reason to change.

Oops! Last month I wrote that there are no stringent ACC rules about how to conduct a tournament. Wrong...our 3 Tournament Commissioners lay down criteria that must be followed when the Tournament Director signs the agreement to hold a tournament...85% payoff, qualifying percentages, a flyer containing all details, etc. Local house rules and gimmicks may also be added at the Director's discretion. Uniformity and fairness is what we're after.

Doris Denny Wins National Open

Doris Denny, Smyrna, GA, is a stellar bridge player, and she also loves her cribbage, dividing her time between the two card games. After winning the 211-player National Open, she may concentrate more on the pegging game. Her last match in this unique double-elimination, best 4 of 7 format, was with Lyle Madlung (WI), and she won going away, and even scored a 28-hand in this match enroute to her win.

Grand Master Bob Drukman (MA) has had much success in Raleigh, and he came close once again, finishing 3rd, followed by another Grand Master who loves the National Open...David Clemmey (MA).

152 players played the Consolation and the pegging whiz from Bellingham, MA, Master Pat Llewellyn, came home the winner. Local John Morch took home 2nd, followed by Bob DeAngelo (VA) and Joseph Gottcent (FL) in 3-4. Rhonda Swift (NC) scored an excellent 20 GP card in the 9-game qualifying round to take honors.

Director Catherine Perkins reported players from 24 states and Canada participated in this prestigious event, played at the beautiful North Raleigh Hilton. And she proudly proclaims the 1999 edition as the "Year of the Woman" as the fair sex won both the Main Event and Consolation...and 4 of 7 events.

Many players were on hand for those last minute MRP's in their quest for National honors, and Grand Master Sharlene Medeiros (MA) took home 24 MRP's in the Consolation...just enough to earn 1,060MRP's and her first All-American berth. Former National Champion Phyllis Schmidt, a One-Star player from Williamstown, MA came close with a season-ending rush, but fell short with 1,019!

340 Peggers Phyllis Schmidt Wins In Reno

One-Star Phyllis Schmidt made a great late-season MRP run by winning the huge 340-player Independence Day Classic in Reno on July 4. She carted home 252 MRPs, and very nearly earned All-American honors to go with her National Championship in 1992. Tony Haag (CA) took home 2nd...and 196 MRP's. Egon Koch loves Reno's play as this Canadian had yet another high finish (3rd), followed by Salem, OR's Joe Cover in 4th.

Jay Snyder (CA) took home his Master rating with a great qualifying round score. He nailed a 39 18/22 +300 for a nifty 65 MRP's.

Bob Julian, a One-Star player from Milwaukee, won the National Championship (but he had to sweat out three long weeks to get confirmation) by winning the 246-player Consolation. Dan Mitchell (CA) very nearly earned his Master by finishing 2nd. Mike McDaniel (WA) continues his winning ways (in Consolations) in taking home 3rd, followed by Master Mel Ashley (CA) in 4th. Gerd Langkau (CA) topped the field in the qualifying round (19 8/9 +182).

Jerry Brooks (OR) nailed a 38 GP card to take qualifying honors.



With one match each in the bag, Doris Denny and Lyle Madlung began the 3rd...and last...match to determine the champion of the National Open. With skunks counting 2 games in this best 4 of 7 match, Denny cut the 5 of hearts for a 28-hand at the skunk line to win via a skunk in the first game...and went on to win the match 4-2!

Lewis & Clark Classic Draws 150 Fischer Tops In South Dakota

Jerry Fischer, a Master pegger from Colby, WI, came to the South Dakota corn belt (Yankton)...and took home a load of hay! His last playoff match pitted him vs. South Dakotan Ken Kaufman, and Fischer prevailed. The win was worth a cool \$1,500! Kaufman's 2nd-place finish is the highest for a player from South Dakota in the 12-year history of this event. Tony Danihel (WI) and Grand Master Al Schaefer (WI) finished 3-4. One-Star Duane Toll (WI) very nearly took home the championship with the year's top qualifying score...a great 43 GP card worth 85 MRP's! He finished the year 4th, missing the 1999 national title by 38 points.

Grand Master Todd Schaefer (MN) won the Consolation...and this win propelled him to his 2nd All-American team honors. Don Ernst (MN) took 2nd, followed by Lyle Lund (MN) and Don Christensen (CO) in 3-4. Doug Henderson (WI) posted a great 19 GP card (9 games) in the qualifying round to take honors.

Grand Master Peter Setian (MA) nipped Al Paulin (RI) for the Consolation win (58 players). Paulin took qualifying honors, scoring a nice 15 GP's in the 8-game round. 



Bob Julian, a newly crowned One-Star player from Milwaukee, WI heads up the 1999 edition of the ACC's Top-Ten All-American team. Julian is one of the ACC's most dedicated players and he earned his 3rd National Championship this cribbage season. He posted 1,344 MRP's in taking the title, barely holding off **William "Wes" Summers II** from Seaside, CA. Summers missed by a scant 9 MRP's and had a steady season, with many fine finishes. He earned his Master rating, in addition to his All-American team honors. Perennial All-American team member and Two-Star **DeLynn Colvert**, Missoula, MT finished 3rd with 1,324 MRP's. He has finished in the top ten 14 of the last 15 years, winning the National title four times. One-Star **Duane Toll**, Oak Creek, WI, is no stranger to top-ten finishes and is a former National Champion (1987). He had a steady season and took home 4th place with a lofty 1,296 MRP's. 
Goodell Featured in Portland Oregonian

Boyd McDonald Favors Strict Interpretation of Rules

Boyd McDonald (CA) e-mailed Cribbage World with his comments about players in the Consolation event. He feels that only players who have lost in the Main Event should be allowed to play. Early round losers should not be allowed to play.

And as for the false claim of game controversy, he feels that strict adherence to the rules is in order, and that a player should not feel guilty in enforcing the rules. He writes, "I have never been forgiven for any of the stupid overpegging mistakes I've made and think that that is the way it should be...if I put up my money to try my skill against all comers, and not feel that I should win just because I had the points in the crib. One of the requirements of the game is that you show your points to your opponent before you peg..."

Alternate Dealing

In March of 1999, I attended a cribbage tournament at Denver. The alternating deal is not according to the regulations as specified in the ACC rules. Please refer to page 3, section 5, (a), which outlines the playing sequence. Also, if there is a question to the definition of the word (match), please refer to Webster's Dictionary. For further instructions on order of dealing, please see section 1, (a). The ACC rule book says nothing about an (alternating deal).

Unless the tournaments can comply with ACC rules, I have no intention of participating in any further tournaments. Please advise me of your stance in this matter.

Hey Earl, lighten up! The ACC rule book in the case you mention concerns playoff matches. The word match is clarified later in the rule book. It states, "One or more games between two players, the outcome of which is a match winner and a match loser. The play of one or more games between two players during tournament qualification play does NOT constitute a match."

I'm believe you are referring to qualifying round play. In this case, a tournament director has the option of cutting for deal every game, or by alternating the deal. The Central Region favors alternating dealing (with a two-game set between players). The Western Region favors one game between players, cutting for the deal.

My personal preference is beginning every game on a level playing field...and that clearly is cutting for the deal!

But the ACC and tournament directors are well within the rule book with the alternating deal in qualifying rounds. I hope that you will accept that ruling. You will get your share of first deals in either scenario. Keep pegging! Ed.


