

## 323 at Reno's Summer Event

# Dick Graham Cops Reno

Grand Master Dick Graham, Engelwood, CO is one of the ACC's founding members...and he proved he can still pick 'em up and lay 'em down as he nailed the 323-player Independence Day Classic in Reno. His last match was a memorable one, as he had to face the streaking Life Master Wayne Steinmetz (WI) in the final playoff match. Graham prevailed and the win netted a cool \$1,850. Steinmetz also took home a sizeable 2nd place check, but, more importantly, he garnered an aggregate 236 MRP's, running his tally to the 1,600 mark for this cribbage year. His chase for the national championship appears out of reach, as frontrunner Jim Langley would win yet again the next week at Lake Tahoe's event (see story this issue).

Ron Balmer (WA) took home 3rd (and 147 MRP's), and Larry Williams (NV) copped 4th (also garnering 147 MRP's). Robert Hibbert (IL) scorched the boards in the qualifying round with a nice 39 16/22 +263 to take home the "Q" prize.

One-Star Bob Julian (WI), Master Sharon Hejtmanek (MT), and Grand Master Rollie Heath (OR) scored high finishes to keep their hats in the annual run for the roses.

Some 226 peggers played the Consolation, and David Campbell took home \$750 in winning this event. He was a long way from his Maine home, and the top prize helped pay for the long trip. One-Star Warren Sondericker (WI), always a threat in Reno, took 2nd, and the 63 MRP's keeps his All-American

hopes alive. Another One-Star player nailed 3rd...Paul Hatcher (OR), with Tom Miller (CA) taking 4th. Norman Nikodym (CA) was smoking in the qualifying round, scoring a grand slam 21 10/10 +173 to easily take honors.

In the Friday night game, Warren Gallagher (MA) scored a grand slam 21 9/9 for a nifty \$750, kicking off the long weekend of pegging on a winning note. Saturday's High Roller saw Master Mel Ashley (CA) take home \$600 for winning that event. Sunday's Last Chance saw Rosemary Hendricks (WA) zip to the win (and take home \$325).

With this large event awarding buckets of MRP's, players will certainly earn new honors. One was Bryant Gilkeson (NV) unofficially earning his Master rating.

Master Roy Cook (CA) was a few hands late scoring his 29-hand (Saturday night playoffs). During the qualifying round this gem was worth \$1,000! He will still get his \$100 from the ACC, however.



Jack Brown (VA) was smoking in the Consolation event. He took qualifying honors (14 6/7 +111) and won the playoffs as well in this 44-player match. His MRP take? A cool 63 MRP's! Eleanor Bernstein (MD) finished 2nd (and qualified 2nd), followed by Dave Sniogowski (VA) and Rick Allen (VA) in 3-4.

Director Bruce Sattler reported that Bennett also won the Saturday Night Special. Joyce Bryant (MD) and Feretta (CA) scored that elusive 28-hand...but no 29's showed.

## **Tiger Woods of Cribbage Langley Wins Again**

Jim Langley, Red Bluff, CA, is a Life Master who is re-writing the record books this cribbage year. And he is doing it in style by winning very nearly every event he has entered since April. This time around he nailed the Peggin' Miner's Classic in Yreka, CA on June 24.

Some 70 peggers showed at this unique Northern California mining town, that now excels at tourism. The local Elks club has one of the most unusual bars in all of cribbage land. This beautifully carved gem was shipped around the "Horn" in the late 1800's to this gold-mining town, and is a "must-see" on any bar-hopper's itinerary. However, in the next room, a cribbage event unfolded for yet another win for Langley. He not only won the playoffs (147 MRP's), but was the meet's top qualifier as well (37 16/22 +235). In keeping alive this record run, Langley scored yet another aggregate 202 MRP's to make a shambles of this year's championship race.

Herschel Mack (CA) very nearly duplicated Langley's run, finishing 2nd in the qualifying round, and taking 2nd in the playoffs. The aggregate MRP's scored unofficially earned Mack his Master rating. Grand Master Ron Morgan (CA) finished 3rd, and the 70 MRP's keep his top-ten hopes alive. Richard Stone (CA) finished 4th.

54 players stayed for the Consolation, and local Brian Folz nailed this event, followed by the streaking Les Sumner (NV), Deena Lowry (CA) and One-Star Jesse Jarrell (CA) in the 2-3-4 spots.

John Stamschor, Big Lake, MN is an ACC player, big-time, and he finished 2nd. The 105 MRP's propelled Stamschor to his Grand Master! He is the 159th ACC player to attain this rating. Master Jerry Fischer (WI) and Sherrill Footz (IA) nailed down 3-4.

Beverly Bliss (CA) scored a great 36 17/22 +176 to earn the top "Q" prize...and some gas money home.

Bill Sperry (MN) is zeroing in on his Grand Master by winning the 40-player Consolation (standing at the 3,800 mark). Grand Master Larry Rowley (WI) finished 2nd (and is nearing his Life Master). Life Master Wayne Steinmetz (WI) scored a few more MRP's in his belated drive for the National Championship (Jim Langley, CA, has it all but wrapped up)...but he will undoubtedly be the bridesmaid this year. ## Langley Wins Truckee Sets All-Time MRP Mark

Life Master Jim Langley, Red Bluff, CA, is on a record-breaking run this spring and summer. After missing the huge Reno event, he came to play (again) at the Truckee River Classic in Kings Beach, CA. This time around, he qualified 2nd (30MRP's), and roared home a winner in the playoffs in this 77-player event. The aggregate 177 MRP's earned vaults Langley to a sky-high unofficial 2,197 MRP's for this cribbage year. This mark breaks One-Star Scott Kooistra's mark of 2,182 set in 1990 (using the old MRP system), and Three-Star DeLynn Colvert's 1997 mark of 1,731 (new MRP system). Since April 21, Langley has won five Main Events and a 3rd at the huge Oregon Coast Classic. This is easily the grandest run in the history of the American Cribbage Congress.

1998 All-American Bob Clark (CA) failed to stop Langley's run in the final playoff match, but Clark had a memorable event as well, qualifying first (24 11/14 +132), and finishing 2nd, netting a nice 145 MRP's. Les Sumner (NV) and Bryant Gilkeson (NV) finished 3-4.

Grand Master Mary Gladish nailed the 44-player Consolation, with Canadian Egon Koch in 2nd. Grand Master Bill Wakeman (CA) is back in action after heart surgery, and he hasn't missed a lick, finishing 3rd. Pete Stemler (NV) also finished in the 3-4 bracket.

Directors Ron Morgan and Greg Schlusner featured a Friday warm-up event, and Walt Krukow (CA) won going away. This event was played at the Kings Beach Conference Center, home of the upcoming Grand National XXI.

The Ginocchio clan (Greg and Julie) had an interesting 24-hand meet. Each 24-hand was awarded a stuffed animal, and Julie earned one on her very first hand. She scored another 24-hand on her very last hand, but by that time, all the animals had been taken. Earlier in the day, Greg scored two 24-hands in a single game (and lost), and he was a tad late for the stuffed animals. Canadian Linton Walker scored a 28-hand, but no 29's showed.

Not only did he take qualifying honors (18 8/9 +114), but won the playoffs as well...and this double win netted an aggregate 66 MRP's (and should pay for some of those 240 fence posts). Director Bill Medeiros scored a nice 20 GP card in the 12-game qualifying round to take honors. Gallagher's high finish moves him ever-closer to his Life Master ranking, and Medeiro's 30 MRP's qualifying score and playoff points keeps him on top of the Eastern Region's MRP list and in a strong position to earn top ten All-American honors for this cribbage year.

42 peggers played the Consolation and it was Warren Gallagher (MA) winning going away. He also took qualifying honors with a 17 GP score (8 games), earning an aggregate 66 MRP's. Life Master Henry DeLong (MA) took home 2nd, followed by Grand Master Dick West (MA) and Grand Master Frank Corrado (CT) in the 3-4 bracket.

According to Director Medeiros, the top three qualifiers all lost in first-round playoff action, attesting to the tough field in attendance...and parity in ACC action. Even the cards showed no preference to any player as nary a 28 or 29-hand showed.


Whew! After re-installing Windows, and checking other programs, all went well. August *Cribbage World* was mailed on time. What next?
