34th Running of the Turtle

St Croix: J. C. Hogan

The 34th running of the St. Croix Classic in Turtle Lake, WI saw a first-time winner! J. C. Hogan (MN) came away with his first sanctioned win, besting a huge crowd (232) and took away 196 MRP's for the effort. His last match vs. Frank Pacocha (WI) came down to the wire and Hogan prevailed. Pacocha nailed down 147 MRP's for his high finish. John Bakeberg (SD) and TOC winner Mike Burns (MN) finished 3-4 (and 105 MRP's each). Master John Aird (MI) scored a nifty 34 16/22 +201 to take Q honors.

Another first-time winner copped the 138-player consolation... Tim Salmen (WI)! He knocked off Dan Pluff (MN) in the final playoff match to come home the winner. Georgian Dave O'Neil, unwinding from directing Grand National XXIII, finished in the 3-4 bracket with Dottie Vandenberg (MA). Daryl Halopka (WI) took Q honors with a 18 8/9 +163 card...21 MRP's plus playoff points.

Director Alan Lindner reported that One-Star Bob McCabe very nearly had a grand slam in the Friday Early Bird (19 8/9 +145) and easily took home the top prize in this 192 player event. On Saturday night it was Grand Master Marlene Lazachek (WI) winning with a 18 8/9 +144 card. Some 168 players were in action for this meet.

Three players scored that elusive 28-hand, worth \$250 each. Bonnie Pacocha and Dottie

Vandenberg scored 28's in the Main qualifying round, and Wally Miskowic scored one in Saturday night's play.

According to Lindner, the casino was buzzing all weekend with the huge crowd, and a birthday party was given to Norb Upton, Larry Rowley, and Warren Sondericker, with birthday cakes for the crowd. And some 330 24-hands were scored at \$25 each, giving a multitude of players a nice bonus for the ride home. Total casino perks came to a whopping \$9,000...with all 34 events played here awarding \$283,425 in perks. This largess certainly contributes to the large crowds that always show for these events. The casino also gives coffee, juice, soda, and hot chocolate for the players.

Some 14 states were represented, and Barbara Woodward and Jennifer Mannix from the Sands in Reno were in town checking out the cribbage action.

Jack Moritzky Continues Roll, Takes Montana Championship

Life Master Jack Moritzky, Mabton, WA, is off and winging to a glorious start this cribbage year. He has won three sanctioned events in three short months and is piling up MRP's galore to begin the new season. His last win was the Montana Championship (Oct 1-3), besting some 109 players in the field, and taking home yet another 147 MRP's. He is setting a torrid pace nationwide in the early going this cribbage year. LeRoy Sabe (MT) took 2nd, followed by Bruce Denend (WA) and Moritzky's wife, Millie, in the 3-4 slot. Each garnered 70 MRP's for this high finish. Sabe was the meet's top Q player, scoring a 36 17/22 +149.

It was almost the Ron Logan Benefit in the Consolation as this Master pegger (AZ) took Q honors (19 9/9) and finished 2nd in the playoffs as well (84 MRP's aggregate). Master Chris McCornas (WA) came away the winner in this 71-player match (84 MRP's). Veteran Grand Master Betty Johnson (WA) and Patti Gossett (OR) finished 3-4.



In the 72-player Consolation it was William Dayton (WI) also winning his first sanctioned event, and he had to do it the hard way, edging Hall o'Famer Bob Madsen (WI) in the final playoff match. Dale Rohm (WI) and Tracy Sweeney (WI) finished 3-4. Veteran Life Master Lloyd "Gabby" Kraft took Q honors with a 15 7/8 +63 card.

His last playoff match was a tough one, pitted vs. 3-time All-American Wayne Steinmetz (WI). Chase, nevertheless, prevailed for the win. Steinmetz's high finish added yet another 70 MRP's to his lofty 12,000+ tally (lifetime). Tim Brunell (IA) and Two-Star Bob Julian (WI) finished 3-4 in this 58-player event.

Mike Burns (MN), a Master pegger that grabbed the TOC win last year in Reno, took home the bacon in the 38-player Consolation, edging Master Bob Joslin (MN) in the final playoff match. New England Wrap Phyllis Schmidt Wins 14th

Two-Star Phyllis Schmidt (MA) continues her superlative play by winning her 14th sanctioned Main Event at the Massachusetts Open, Medway, MA in late September. With a sizeable field (98), Schmidt came away with yet another 147 MRP's to add to her 16,000 MRP lifetime tally. Mike Fetchel (CT) came close, but settled for 2nd, followed by Mark Soule (ME) and Master Joe Beauregard (RI) in the 3-4 slot. Beauregard is closing in on his Grand Master with this high finish. Fetchel was also the top Q player with a nice 24 11/12 +182 card.

Life Master John Rooney (MA) took home the Consolation win, nipping Ron Rapoza (RI) in the final playoff match. Lynn Babbitt (RI) and Jerry Hardy (ME) finished 3-4. Hardy was last year's ACC Rookie of the Year, and also earned All-American honors as well.

Director Shawn Jordan reported Sharlene Medeiros (MA) and Rick Montague (MA) scored that elusive 28-hand, but no 29's showed.

Bob Drukman Cops New Hampshire Open

With players from all the New England States and Hawaii in action, it was Life Master Bob Drukman (MA) taking home the marbles at the recent New Hampshire Open. Master Robert Fitzgerald (CT) took home 2nd in this 94-player event, followed by Life Master Rob Medeiros (MA) and Life Master Sharlene Medeiros (MA) (not related) in the 3-4 slot. One-Star David Clemmey (MA) took the Q action with a 22 GP card, making a clean sweep for this highly-ranked quintet.

With 48 peggers in action in the Consolation, Vicki Soule (ME) came home the winner, nipping Master Tom Clark (NH) in the final playoff match. Master David Campbell (ME) and Grand Master Neil Friets (NH) finished 3-4. Master Sue Cousens (ME) took Q honors with a 16 GP card.



American Cribbage Congress Hall of Fame

Hall of Fame Nominating Criteria

1- All nominations for the American Cribbage Congress Hall of Fame must be submitted in writing to the Chairman of the Balloting Committee

2- An individual nominated for the American Cribbage Congress Hall of Fame must meet the following **mandatory** criteria:

A- be a member in good standing of the ACC for seven (7) consecutive years or have been a member for a minimum of five (5) consecutive years until death intervened.

B- have displayed and complied with the rules of ethical play.

C- have displayed and complied with the standards of good sportsmanship.

3- In addition, to be eligible for nomination, a candidate is required to meet at least three (3) of the following **optional** criteria. He or she must have:

A- promoted the game of cribbage and/or served the American Cribbage Congress by specific acts or as specified in the written nomination.

B- established his/her expertise by being rated a Master player or higher.

C- established his/her expertise by being rated a Bronze Award recipient or higher in Grass Roots competition.

D- served as a Tournament Director, or Co-director, of an ACC sanctioned tournament for a minimum of five (5) years.

E- served as a Grass Roots Director, or Co-director, for a minimum of five (5) years.

F- served as a member of the Board of Directors of the American Cribbage Congress for a minimum of four (4) years

4- Any exceptions to or exemptions from the above criteria must be initiated by a current member of the ACC Board of Directors.

Hall of Fame Balloting Procedures

1. Publish annually in the October issue of *Cribbage World* the criteria for nominating individuals to the Hall of Fame. Declare that nominations are currently being accepted and must be in written form limited to one (1) page to the Chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee of the ACC, **postmarked no later than December 10 of that year.**

2. The Chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee will review all letters of nomination received for compliance with the nominating criteria and submit those letters to the ACC Hall of Fame Committee.

3. Voting will take place at the Board of Directors meeting held in conjunction with the JPW/ACC Open Tournament in Reno, NV. All attending current ACC Board members have voting rights and each eligible nominee will be voted on by the Board.

4. Each nominee will be notified of the results of the balloting applicable to him/her. The President of the ACC or the Chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee will notify in writing any members who are elected to the Hall of Fame. Induction, if any, will take place at the Grand National Tournament and Awards banquet later that year.

ORGANIZED CRIBBAGE GETS A PUYALLUP BOUNCE!

Seattle-area Grass Roots Cribbage Clubs promoted cribbage in a big way from September 10 -26 at the Western Washington Fair in Puyallup, WA. This is the fifth largest fair in North America and the largest west of the Mississippi River.

Nearly 100 volunteers promoted cribbage in a unique way over that 17-day period. They challenged visitors to a game of cribbage. Certificates were awarded fair-goers who won. Nearly 500 certificates were awarded in this manner. Hundreds of decks of playing cards were given away to lucky players. Information relative to the American Cribbage Congress and organized clubs was distributed. Over 4,000 brochures "Cribbage Anyone?" were distributed. Hundreds of back issues of Cribbage World walked away with those fair visitors. Hundreds of pamphlets on how to play cribbage were distributed.

Fair attendance was expected to exceed 1,700,000. According to conservative estimates, half a million passed directly in front of the cribbage display. Folks were lined up waiting for an available chair for much of those 17 days. Thousands completed an entry form to be eligible to win a customized cribbage board. Each of the clubs in the area provided one of these boards.

Visitors to the fair were from every State, Canadian provinces, and some foreign countries. Regardless of home location, visitors who showed an interest were provided information as to club locations, playing schedules, contacts, etc. The primary purpose of the display was to create a public awareness of organized cribbage wherever located. Another Puget-sound community has a cribbage club as a direct result of this effort. A new club has been chartered in Puyallup.

Grass Roots clubs that participated in some way are as follow: Chehalis-Centralia Cribbage Club, Everett Peggars, Kirkland Peggars, Kitsap Peggars, Lacey Peggars, Pierce County "31-for-2" Peggars, Sea-Tac Peggars, and Sno-King Peggars.

Cliff Brandsma, Director of the Lacey Peggars, has organized and coordinated this project over the past seven years. The area has an increased number of Grass Roots Cribbage Clubs and WA ACC memberships have grown by 1,000 since 1996. The ACC offers three tournaments per week that are sanctioned and open to both ACC members and non-members alike. We also have our own ratings point system, based on tournament performance and total number of players entered. We also offer special "members-only" tournaments at various times.

There is no cost for entry into the ACC Internet Tournaments and we have many of the national leaders playing regularly. 

TIP OF THE MONTH

The One Point Bluff by DeLynn Colvert

When holding A-10-J-Q (or an ace with any ten cards) and your opponent leads a 3, you have a dilemma. If your opponent has a 2, you cannot escape a 2-point peg by playing a ten card. This is the time to run a bluff, and play your ace (for "four"). Your opponent could very well surmise you are trying to start a run, and will play his ten card, giving you a chance for a free pair.

In any case, this bluff will cost you only a point if your opponent plays his 2 for a run of three...and very well may reward you with a pair of ten cards. Do NOT run this bluff if your opponent is in a very obvious board position where he will score at all costs and the extra point allowed will hurt your position.

Rule of the month review:

Crosschecking Guidelines: After a game is completed, each player signs the other's scorecard. This means that when you sign the card, you are certifying that the score, as entered is correct. If both cards record a win, both cards are changed to losses with the lower point spread accepted, if relevant. If both cards record losses then both get credit for a loss. If the point spread is recorded on only one card, this number is accepted for both cards and recorded on the blank card.

Bronze and Silver Awards: During the 2003-2004 Grass Roots season, 106 members earned their Bronze award & 10 members earned their silver award.

For our newer members: What are Bronze and Silver Awards? Every time a local club holds a Grass Roots Tournament, the top 20% of that club's members are awarded the gamepoints they earned during the tournament. These points are cumulative to date and as the season's pass, a members point total increases. 1,000 points are needed for the Bronze level and 2,500 points are required for the Silver level. Towards the end of the season in which you qualify for one of these levels, you will be contacted by the Awards Procurement Chairperson and asked which award you would like to select. Available awards are provided to your club director at the start of each season if you'd like to review the selections.


